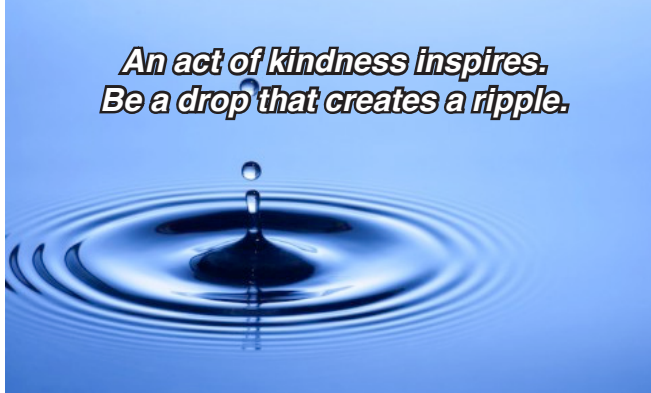

From his experience making the film, he recalls, "One day of shooting that will always stay with me was when we covered a group of students and teachers marching through the streets of their village to create AIDS awareness. Many of the kids had lost parents to HIV. Onlookers weren't kind but the kids were bold and held their heads high." He is honored to tell their story.

We give our time and resources to support healthcare, education, environmental and socio-economic programs in developing countries. We currently support grassroots organizations in India, Kenya, Vietnam and the Philippines. Sahaya means "help" in Sanskrit. Thanks to our dedicated volunteers and donors, our achievements include more than 300 child sponsorships, construction of 3 schools, and many education and treatment programs of HIV/AIDS. We also focus on prevention of dengue fever, a home-building program, and empowerment through vocational training and entrepreneurship.
